ABOUT THE COURSES

Course 1 Design for Production

Instructor: Dr. Thomas Lamb

This course Introduces Design for Production, which is the deliberate act of designing a product to meet its specified technical and operational requirements and quality so that the production costs will be minimal through low work content and ease of construction.

Course 2 Practical Seakeeping

Instructor: Dr. Edward Lewandowski

This course provides a basic understanding of the fundamentals of ship motion theory and current practice in the development of seakeeping predictions. Students will gain the ability to develop or assess seakeeping performance requirements, and to carry out seakeeping predictions for a given design.

Course 3 Floating Offshore Engineering Facilities and Mooring Systems

Instructor: Professor Robert E. Randall

Floating offshore engineering facilities continue to serve the offshore industry and produce energy around the world. The purpose of this continuing education course is to provide naval architects, marine and ocean engineers, and other interested conference participants an introduction to floating offshore facilities and their mooring systems.

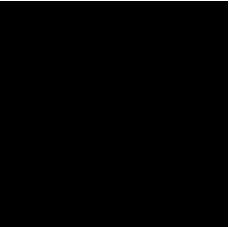
